MANAGING THE ATLANTIC SALMON IN A RAPIDLY CHANGING ENVIRONMENT - MANAGEMENT CHALLENGES AND POSSIBLE RESPONSES

3 & 4 June 2019

Tromsø, Norway

To mark the International Year of the Salmon, a two-day Symposium will be held ahead of the North Atlantic Salmon Conservation Organization's (NASCO) Annual Meeting, which in 2019 is being hosted by Norway in Tromsø. People connected with, inspired by or passionate about wild Atlantic salmon are invited to take part in the Symposium.

If your work deals with the challenges this species is facing, we encourage you to submit a poster abstract to the Symposium Steering Committee for consideration. Successful applicants will be able to present a poster at the Symposium in June 2019, and the abstract and / or poster will be included in the proceedings of the Symposium.

Deadline for submission:	15 February 2019
Notification of poster acceptance:	5 March 2019

The speakers for the Symposium have been invited, and a full programme will be released shortly. Attendance is open to all, and anyone wishing to submit an abstract to be considered for participation in the poster session is welcome to do so.

Guidelines for abstracts:

- the planned poster must align with the Symposium focus on the challenges facing wild Atlantic salmon and provide possible responses to these challenges to show what needs to be done to conserve this precious resource in a rapidly changing environment;
- abstract length is limited to a maximum of 300 words. Please provide a title in addition to this. The title must avoid abbreviations (abbreviations may be used in the text if they are defined when used first) and the author's names (first name, surname) and affiliation (institution, country) should be given. Degrees, titles, street addresses should be omitted. A recommended layout is provided on the next page of this document.

- all authors with accepted abstracts must agree to the inclusion of their abstract and / or poster in outputs from the Symposium, including the proceedings of the Symposium, and must register to display their poster during the Symposium.

Your thoughts on how you think NASCO can contribute to the responses would also be appreciated.
