1.2 Describe any major new initiatives or achievements for salmon conservation and management that you wish to highlight.
<p>New agreement between Finland and Norway on the River Teno/Tana salmon fisheries was applied second time for fishing season 2018. Fishing rules reduce fishing time for all gear types used. Aim is to reduce fishing mortality by 30 %, in order to enable recovery of weak salmon stocks especially in the upper reaches of the Teno system. New agreement is in line with the NASCO recommendations concerning stock-specific, target-based management of salmon fisheries.</p> <p>Monitoring data from the River Teno indicated that the new regulation has reduced fishing mortality at the expected rate. The observed reduction rate will enable recovery of the weak salmon stocks in the estimated time-frame, two salmon generations, as planned.</p>

Action F1:	Description of Action <i>(as submitted in the IP)</i>	Preparation of the new fishery agreement between Norway and Finland is underway (concerning river fisheries, coastal fishery is the responsibility of Norwegian national management).
	Expected Outcome <i>(as submitted in the IP)</i>	New restrictions, decrease in fishing mortality in relation to reference point achievement.
	Progress on Action to Date <i>(Provide a brief overview with a quantitative measure of progress. Other material (e.g. website links) will not be evaluated.)</i>	The agreement signed in September 2016 and in force from the 2017 fishing season (1 June) onwards. After the Agreement came into force, work has been focused on involvement of stakeholder groups to new regime (new fishing rules for all gear types and mandatory catch reporting system, for example), and designing a common management plan with Norwegian authorities and the local stakeholders from both countries.

Action F2:	Description of Action <i>(as submitted in the IP)</i>	Spawning targets have been established and annually assessed for five tributaries of the Teno river. Bilateral collaboration between Finland and Norway is underway for defining targets for more tributaries.

	Expected Outcome (as submitted in the IP)	More accurate spawning targets in more rivers enable better coverage in stock status assessment in the large, versatile Teno system.
	Progress on Action to Date (Provide a brief overview with a quantitative measure of progress. Other material (e.g. website links) will not be evaluated.)	Spawning target attainments are being assessed annually for 14 tributaries and the River Teno main stem. In 2018, the salmon run in the Teno main stem was monitored by sonar for the first time. Monitoring provided direct estimates of total run size and improved the estimated exploitation rates for both the Teno mainstem and the tributaries. Major result of the monitoring in 2018 was that the exploitation estimates showed decreasing exploitation for all individual salmon stocks in the mixed-stock fishery in the Teno mainstem, following the newly implemented agreement between Norway and Finland.

Collaborative project between Finland and Norway for improving road culverts started in 2017. 	Expected Outcome (as submitted in the IP)	Spread of <i>Gyrodactylus salaris</i> is prevented.

The new fisheries agreement in Teno is further strengthening the action against spreading <i>Gyrodactylus salaris</i> . Preparations for more active information at Finnish-Russian boarder station in the River Tuloma watershed was prepared. Existing network of disinfection stations and information have functioned in a planned manner, no infected areas found.

In River Näättämojoki, local co-operation among fishing rights owners has continued and resulted in voluntary reduction of their fishing effort in latest years, reduced fishing days for traditional gears compared to regulations in the Näättämo fisheries agreement. Recreational fishing effort in River Näättämojoki is based on a quota for the amount of fishing licences across three fishing zones, and the quotas have been set both temporally (different parts of the season) and spatially by the state authority (Metsähallitus).
