



***NASCO/ICES Salmon Summit***  
***‘Salmon at Sea: Scientific Advances and their Implications for Management’***

**Call for papers**

The NASCO/ICES Salmon Summit, a major international symposium that will review recent scientific advances in understanding the distribution, migration and survival of salmon at sea and their implications for management, is being held in L’Aquarium, La Rochelle, France during 11 - 13 October 2011. This symposium marks the culmination of SALSEA, the largest ever research programme on the marine phase of the Atlantic salmon’s life-cycle. The proceedings of the symposium will be published as a special issue of the ICES Journal of Marine Science. The Co-Convenors invite those wishing to contribute papers or posters to submit titles and an abstract of less than 200 words **no later than 31 January 2011** to:

Because of constraints on time and space, it is likely that the number of both oral and poster contributions will have to be limited. The Co-Convenors are likely to give priority to contributions that highlight any management implications arising from the research presented. Authors of contributions accepted for presentation at the symposium (either orally or as posters), and for possible publication in the ICES Journal of Marine Science, will be notified by 31 March 2011. Details of the format of the work to be submitted will be provided at that time. The following will be due by 1 September:

1. Final abstract of 200 words or less for inclusion in a volume of collated abstracts to be distributed at registration;
2. Manuscripts of papers and posters for publication in the ICES Journal of Marine Science to be submitted for peer review.
